

Maple Glen Club Rules 2010

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| 1 Fees | All fees are due at the opening of the club. |
| 2 Visitors | Visitors must register upon entering the camp grounds. Members are responsible for their visitors. |
| 3 Minors | Children under 18 years of age must not be left alone for any lengthy period of time (Vermont State Law).
Minors must be supervised by adults when using club facilities (e.g. Pool, Hot tub or Clubhouse) |
| 4 Motorized Vehicles | All motorized vehicles must not exceed eight (8) miles per hour on the camp ground. The use of such vehicles is to be minimized in a effort to reduce dust, noise and air pollution. Adults are responsible for any damages caused by minors. |
| 5 Gate | The electronic gate must be kept closed at all times. |
| 6 Cameras | No pictures are to be taken on the club grounds (still or video) without the permission of the subject(s) and Maple Glen. We reserve the right to seize any photographic equipment from you if this rule is broken. |
| 7 Sites | The lessee is responsible for the cleanliness of the leased site; this includes but is not restricted to the following: Grass cutting, removal of rubbish and debris, general appearance of grounds and structures including mobile homes and trailers. Kitchen garbage is to be deposited in the garbage container located at the sand pit. Garbage is not to be burned in fire pits nor be dumped in the wetlands area, please contact the board for disposal instructions. Sites may not have fences erected around them. Hedges to a maximum height of three feet are allowed. For sale signs are only to be placed in the window of property for sale. Unregistered motorized highway vehicles may not be stored at Maple Glen. The care and maintenance of access roads leading to members sites are the responsibility of the users. Common use roads must remain accessible to common users at all times. |
| 8 Drugs | The use of illegal drugs is not permitted on the club grounds. |
| 9 Alcohol | Glass containers or bottles must not be used in the common areas and alcohol must be transported and consumed discreetly.
People who are obviously under the influence of alcohol will not be tolerated on club grounds. |
| 10 Pets | Pets are welcome at Maple Glen. Dogs must be in an enclosure or on a leash at all time. Dogs are not allowed in the pool area. Should you walk your dog on club grounds you are to pick up any droppings and properly dispose of same. Dogs must not be left unattended in a manner that causes them to bark and annoy neighbors. |
| 11 Noise | Quiet time is between 11.00 pm to 9.00 am. At all times volume levels of any electronic device should never be at a level that causes annoyance to neighbors. Construction noises are tolerated before July 1st and after Labor day, however special care should be taken at these times, especially on Sundays. |
| 12 Camp fires | Fires must be extinguished prior to retiring or leaving the club grounds. |
| 13 Clothing | Maple Glen is a nudist resort, all members and guests, including children, must be naked when conditions permit in all areas. |
| 14 Hot Tub | Showers are mandatory before entering the hot tub or the pool. Anyone found using the hot tub without first showering with soap at the clubhouse will be refused further access to this facility. |
| 15 Membership | All new members are subject to a probation period equal to a full season. In the event that the board of directors deems that a probationary individual (or individuals) are no longer welcome they will be requested to leave the camp without any explanation or recourse. |
| 16 Acts that require approval from the Board of Directors | The cutting of trees, installation of outdoor showers, all construction above and below ground, installation of lights and reflectors, sale of any fixed property. Only current dues paying members in good standing are eligible to purchase shares of Maple Glen |
